Why you should use Schooldiary.it....

With it you can:

- Check your **time tables**.
- Record your **homework**.
- **Record** your learning.
- **Review** your learning.
- Use it as an aid to **revision planning**.

Teachers

This is a Students and Teachers School Planner. For use with students - set the **20 word a day** schooldiary.it challenge. Ask students to **record** the day's learning **every night** in 20 words. This is **good practice** and it helps solve the perennial homework issue. Experience shows they will write much more than 20 words. Ask parents to engage with the diary - it works.

Alternatively, use schooldiary.it as a space for students to record their learning during the **plenary**. Now there is **no need** for students to **lose** their time tables any more.

Using the learning log page, students can have subject by **subject learning logs**. This is an excellent starting point for **revision** and great for discussions at **parents' evenings**. Teachers can use this function to produce subject by subject logs of what they've taught. They can use these logs to share lessons and build schemes of work.

As a teacher or student's planner it can be used on a desktop computer, laptop, tablet or smart phone. Using these devices students can record and reflect on their learning inside or outside of the class room...

The search function enables you or students to find specific pieces of information from notes, making this very useful as a diary.

Parents

There are a number of benefits to parents:

You can have much deeper conversations at home about learning. The process starts as children complete their learning log for the day. **Engage** with what your child has written by **asking questions** and **rewarding** the effort of doing it. As you and your child become clearer about what has been recorded, ask them to **amend** and **add** to their records. This cycle pays dividends in terms of **developing recall** and **adding depth** to conversations.

Children don't always share what's happened during the school day easily. Doing the learning log **helps them remember** and **articulate** the days learning. Doing the learning log in the first place is dressed up as the '**20 Word Challenge**'. Experience shows that they will write much more than 20 words.

The subject log function is a great starting point for conversations at parents evenings. With it you can discuss how the learning is progressing and how it can be enhanced. The subject log is also a great starting point for revision as it can produce lists of topics covered.

Schools

Schooldiary.it is a '**win-win**' product. It's easy to use. It can be a powerful tool that supports learning and helps **embed habits** of **reflecting on learning outside** the class room. It can help **parents engage** with their children's learning.

Using the teachers sign up, colleagues can use schooldiary.it instead of the traditional paper planner. They can produce subject by subject **teaching logs** to help with **quality assurance** and **collaborative planning**. Teachers and students can use it on any internet connected device – desktop computer, laptop, tablet or smart phone.

Schooldiary.it is very **flexible**. Students can use it as a **learning log**, a **homework record**, and a starting point for **planning revision**. Parents and students can use it in **conversation** at parents evening to add detail to discussion about progress, learning and how it can be enhanced.

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
